

RE-SEED

*Retirees Enhancing Science Education
through Experiments and Demonstrations*

Since 1991, the RE-SEED program at Northeastern University has trained people with backgrounds in science or mathematics to provide classroom assistance to middle school science teachers. After taking part in a comprehensive training program, participants typically volunteer in middle school classrooms one day a week for most of the academic year.



Close to 500 RE-SEED volunteers have worked in schools in about 100 communities throughout the country, offering approximately 500,000 hours of their time. The next RE-SEED training program in the Boston area will be held at Northeastern University starting in March 2008.
